NAMI Washington **2024 Legislative Priorities**



Expansion and Improvements on the 988/Behavioral Health Crisis System

- SB 5853: Extends the 23-hour Behavioral Health Crisis Facility model to provide crisis services for youth
- SB 6251: Coordinating Regional Crisis Response and Suicide **Prevention Services**

Increase Access to Quality Mental Health Services

- SB 6144: Increase access to behavioral health prescribers and medication by expanding prescribing authority to psychologists
- HB 1946: Establishing the WA Health Corps Behavioral Health Scholarship Program to provide scholarships for individuals pursuing behavioral health professions working in underserved communities

Youth and Young Adult Mental Health

- HB 2239: Supports student well-being by providing support for public schools teaching skills that promote social, emotional and mental health wellness.
- HB 2280/SB 6216: Establishing a statewide network to maintain. expand, and provide oversight to Washington's school-based mental and behavioral health system for youth.
- HB 1929/SB 6050: Supports young adults discharged from inpatient behavioral health treatment by creating a supportive transitional housing and behavioral health program



NAMI Washington Budget Priorities

- Funding for NAMI support programs for affiliates and state office (\$500K)
- Medicaid Rate Increase for Behavioral Healthcare Providers (\$44.9 million)
- In-patient Bed Capacity (72 bed at Western State, 38 beds at Eastern State
- Youth Behavioral Health (\$11.1 million)

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
