

VOTING IN WASHINGTON STATE

Washington conducts elections primarily by mail. If you are an active registered voter, then you can expect to receive a ballot in the mail. It will be sent to the mailing address you used to register to vote. If you are registered, you can check the status of your ballot or change your address at voter.votewa.gov

How to Register to Vote?

You can register to vote online at voter.votewa.gov by mail or in person at your local elections office. For a list of offices, you can check voter.votewa.gov OR sos.wa.gov. You can register by mail or online up to one week before election day and on election day in-person.



When to Vote?

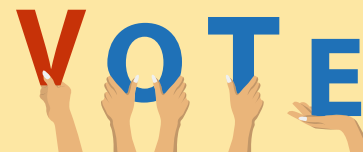
In 2024 the Primary Election takes place on August 6 and General Election is on November 5. Ballots are mailed out at least 18 days before each election.

You can register to vote in WA if you are:

- A citizen of the United States
- A legal resident of Washington state for at least 30 days prior to election day
- At least 18 years old (16 and 17 year olds can sign up as a *future voter*)
- Not disqualified from voting due to a court order
- Not currently serving a sentence of total confinement in prison under the jurisdiction of the department of corrections for a Washington felony conviction
- Not currently incarcerated for a federal or out-of-state felony conviction *see reverse for info on voting after incarceration.

Returning your ballot

- You can return your ballot by mail, as long as it's postmarked by Election Day.
- You can also drop your ballot off in a designated ballot drop box or voting center by 8pm on Election Day.



FAQS ON VOTING IN WA STATE

I lost my ballot, or didn't get it, what do I do?

You can get a replacement ballot. Just ask! Contact your local county elections office. Remember, your county may only accept one ballot and will verify your signature. Alternatively, you can obtain a replacement ballot delivered online by logging into votewa.gov.

Where can I learn about what's on my ballot?

*If a voter is convicted of a felony in Washington State, their right to vote is automatically restored when they are released from total confinement in prison. Once released, the voter must re-register to vote in order to receive a ballot.
