Our Jewish tradition teaches: “A ruler is not to be appointed unless the community is first consulted.” This means that voters should pick our leaders. We want a vibrant, inclusive, and representative democracy where everyone belongs, regardless of skin color, ZIP code, disability, or gender identity.”
